On behalf of the team at South Florida Motorsports (SFM), we are delighted to welcome you to Miami Gardens for this year's FORMULA 1 CRYPTO.COM MIAMI GRAND PRIX. Whether you are making your inaugural trip or returning to the Miami International Autodrome for a third year, it is our sincere desire to offer you an enjoyable and seamless experience as you cover the race and surrounding events, while also offering an environment that is authentically Miami from start to finish.

We have worked hard to make the FORMULA 1 CRYPTO.COM MIAMI GRAND PRIX 2024 our best event to date, with more on-track action than ever before, a star-studded off-track entertainment lineup and intentionally curated offerings across campus, from luxury suites to general admission areas and everything in between. We are eager to welcome both media and fans to our Campus once again for a weekend of premier racing and hospitality.



1.4.2 EXPLORE OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

Greater Miami & Miami Beach is a tapestry of diverse and exciting neighborhoods. Each is a unique destination unto itself thanks to the diverse cultures, landscapes and people that call these places home. There's something new to experience each time you visit.

<p>MIAMI BEACH</p> <p>Miami Beach is a global arts and culture destination. It has a rich history as a cultural center, from the world-famous entertainment scene of the 1950s to today's modern South Beach. The Atlantic Ocean stretches along the beach for miles, lined with Art Deco and mid-century modern hotels. Visit the Art Deco Historic District, explore Miami Beach museums, visit cool shopping districts, enjoy family-friendly activities and see performances at unique venues. This slender, nine-mile-long barrier island is divided into three distinct neighborhoods: South Beach, Mid Beach and North Beach.</p>
<p>South Beach: Art Deco Charm and More</p> <p>See the Miami Beach you know from the movies in the iconic South Beach neighborhood. Miami Beach, a slender, nine-mile-long barrier island along the Atlantic Ocean, is divided into three distinct neighborhoods. South Beach - from <u>South Pointe Park</u> north to 23rd Street - is the most famous of the trio, home to sandy strands, swaying palms and the pastel-colored Art Deco buildings that have become synonymous with this iconic destination and render it so undeniably photogenic.</p>
<p>Mid Beach: In the Heart of Miami Beach</p> <p>Enjoy a combination of "South Beach cool" and "North Beach calm" in Mid Beach, a central spot in Miami Beach that offers the best of both its beachfront neighbors. Consider Mid Beach a captivating combination of everything there is to love about Greater Miami. This diverse neighborhood between 24th and 60th streets has swanky hotels, stylish restaurants and lounges, its own arts district and, of course, that famous swath of sand that beckons both visitors and locals.</p>
<p>North Beach: A Relaxing Retreat</p> <p>Life moves at a leisurely pace in North Beach, the relaxed Miami Beach neighborhood that runs from 60th Street up to the town of Surfside. In this largely residential area, you won't see the Art Deco buildings that characterize South Beach. Instead, the striking architectural style is Miami Modernism (MiMo) architecture. The broad beach is just as alluring - and chances are you'll have fewer people with which to share it.</p>
<p>DOWNTOWN MIAMI/BRICKELL</p> <p>Culture and history meet industry and entertainment in Downtown Miami. Greater Miami is synonymous with beautiful beaches and towering palm trees - but in its urban center, it's the cityscape of glittering skyscrapers over Biscayne Bay that gets all the attention. Diverse, dynamic and densely populated, Downtown Miami and the adjoining Brickell area is a hub of international finance, dining, arts and entertainment that no visitor should miss.</p>
<p>ALLAPATTAH</p> <p>The artistic spirit that filled the Wynwood neighborhood with art galleries, street art, and hip bars and restaurants has extended west to Allapattah.</p>

Currency





While the 20 drivers remain with the same teams from last season, the technical and sporting regulations are virtually identical too. But here are a few small tweaks to the rules this year...

1. Review time periods

An area that can regularly cause controversy is when a team wants to appeal a decision or a situation that has occurred in a previous race. One of the avenues open to them is the 'Right of Review' that is in the FIA's International Sporting Code. Teams can try and revisit decisions that have already been ruled upon, as long as they can provide a "significant and relevant new element discovered which was unavailable to the parties seeking the review at the time of the decision concerned." The window to lodge such an appeal was previously 14 days from the decision being made, but now teams must do so within four days - or 96 hours - with the potential for a 24-hour extension to that deadline in special circumstances.

2. Increase in potential fines

Not only are teams facing smaller windows to lodge certain appeals, but both themselves and their drivers could be facing bigger fines for breaking the rules, too. In the past, the maximum fine that the stewards could impose under the International Sporting Code was \$270,000 but that has been quadrupled this year. Other categories have also seen an increase as the FIA stated the figure had not been revisited in more than a decade, but it opens F1 drivers and teams up to some costly punishments.

3. F1 Sprint format tweak

The F1 Sprint returns in 2024 with six events to look forward to. Brazil will host its fourth consecutive Sprint weekend this season, with Austria to stage its third. Austin and Qatar will be returning for a second year, and China and Miami will join the line-up for the first time.

What will look slightly different is a small tweak to the format of a Sprint weekend, which was agreed by the F1 Commission. For this year, Sprint Qualifying will move from Saturday to Friday, following an initial free practice session for track acclimatization and set-up work. The 100km Sprint will then take place on Saturday, ahead of qualifying for the Grand Prix later that day. The Grand Prix itself will remain on Sunday.

4. Bigger promotional events

At the beginning of the year you might see teams carrying out shakedown runs before the pre-season test in Bahrain gets under way, and wonder how they're allowed to. Well, teams can run current cars on two occasions as promotional events, usually used for filming for partners as well as checking the car works as it should. In the past, these days were limited to 100km of mileage in total - 20 laps of a 5km circuit - but from 2024 teams can now do double that distance as part of each day, but only one event per day. Now with 200km available, it provides greater opportunity for shaking a car down pre-season and capturing more footage at the same time.

5. Changes to testing old cars

Teams are allowed to run cars that are at least two years old as part of a testing program, often providing opportunities for young drivers. Given the major change in regulations, the 2021 car was also allowed to be used in 2022, as it provided so little crossover information that it wouldn't be valuable to the current car. However, with the 2022 car now becoming part of the permitted Testing of Previous Car (TPC) program, it has been clarified that all components have to have run at least once either in an official testing session or race weekend to then be allowed on a previous car. That's to stop teams testing items during a TPC run that then could make their way onto the current car.

6. Increased CapEx limits

The introduction of the cost cap has seen the gap between the front and the back of the grid closing up, with all ten teams making multiple Q3 appearances last year. In order to ensure the biggest teams don't have a locked-in advantage due to the cost cap, teams can now spend more over a four-year period on Capital Expenditure (CapEX), in order to upgrade their facilities.

What was a limit of \$45m for the rolling four years has been increased to \$65m for the four teams that have finished in the bottom four of the standings on average since 2020. The three teams that have averaged in the middle of the standings in that time all have an increased CapEx limit of \$58m, while the top three of Red Bull, Mercedes and Ferrari can spend \$51m over the four-year period. Doing so can ensure teams are more efficient under the cost cap and therefore actually able to create a better car for less cost each year in future.

7. Even more strict roll hoop requirements

As already referenced a year ago, there have been a number of changes made to roll hoop requirements in response to Zhou Guanyu's serious crash at the start of the 2022 British Grand Prix. On top of last year's changes to the shape of roll hoop designs and a minimum height for the point of application of the homologation test, from this year roll hoops must be able to withstand a much stricter load test to make them even more robust in the case of a similar accident to the one Zhou experienced.

8. Plan for wheel displays dropped

Since the introduction of the 2022 regulations, cars have had wheel covers that have an impact on aerodynamics. These have also opened up opportunities for displaying information, and originally the intention was for wheel covers to carry a rotating display within them this year.

That change would have had an impact on the overall weight limit of the car too, but while the details were previously included in the regulations, they were retracted during last year and now won't be implemented in 2024. It's an area that could be revisited in future, though.

9. DRS activation

One additional change that was agreed by the F1 Commission in February, concerns DRS. This season DRS activation for the race will be anticipated to one lap as opposed to two laps after the start of the race, or the re-start following a Safety Car.

Bonus points

The driver who records the fastest lap of the race will get one bonus point. However, the driver must also finish in the top 10 in order to qualify for the point. This is to stop all the drivers outside the top 10 pitting for fresh tyres in the last few laps in an effort to set a fastest lap, which would compromise the integrity of the race.

Sprint Events

This year Miami will host an F1 Sprint for the first time which will bring three days of competitive track action to the Miami International Autodrome. Originally devised in 2021, the Sprint offers an extra qualifying session and a 100km race in place of practice. The Sprint is one-third of the distance of a Grand Prix and lasts for approximately half an hour.

Miami is the second of six events to host a Sprint in 2024, following the first in China at the previous round. Spielberg, Austin, Brazil and Qatar will also feature Sprint races this year. All tracks were chosen based on their overtaking potential, as drivers are encouraged to race flat-out to the chequered flag. Last year, there were 52 official overtakes during the Grand Prix at the Miami International Autodrome, up from 45 the previous year.

Following a meeting of the F1 Commission, it was decided to update the weekend timetable for races hosting this format. Sprint Qualifying (formerly known as the Shootout) will now take place in Miami on Friday afternoon (4.30pm) with the shorter-distance race taking place on Saturday at 12 noon. Qualifying for the main event will continue in its usual Saturday afternoon slot with the 57-lap FORMULA 1 CRYPTO.COM MIAMI GRAND PRIX on Sunday, May 5.

Sprint Qualifying on Friday afternoon follows a similar format to traditional Qualifying, with five drivers eliminated at each stage, but with a shorter time for each session to increase the jeopardy. The three stages, SQ1, SQ2 and SQ3 last 12 minutes, 10 minutes and just eight minutes respectively. Medium compound tires are mandatory for the first two sessions, while softs must be used for SQ3.

Miami will be the 14th Sprint event to have taken place since it was introduced in 2021. Originally, the result of the shorter-format race formed the grid for the main event and only handed out points for the top three. It often meant drivers were unwilling to take risks, as any retirement would place them at the back of the grid for the Grand Prix itself. When the Sprint was expanded to six events last year, it became a standalone feature of the weekend with points now awarded to the top eight finishers. There are no points for fastest lap and no mandatory pit stops.

While the Sprint no longer determines the grid for the Grand Prix, it can still have an influence on the outcome. For example, any significant crash damage might lead to a chassis change and that would result in a pit lane start for the main event. And any drivers that pick up a grid penalty for an on-track misdemeanor would need to serve those in the Grand Prix itself. It's why you'll need to keep an eye on all the track action in Miami across the whole weekend this year.






You can usually expect great racing and decent amounts of overtaking in Bahrain, while the drivers have to contend with wind, racing under floodlights and the difficulty of finding a decent set-up with the wide temperature fluctuations between sessions. The track's most challenging point is the tight, downhill, off-camber Turn 10 left-hander, while the fast run through Turn 12 is another highlight, allowing the racers to really feel their cars coming alive.

Since the inaugural Saudi Arabian Grand Prix took place in 2001, it has been recognised as the world’s longest and fastest street race. It joins its Middle Eastern counterparts in Bahrain and Abu Dhabi - while like those races, the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix also takes place under floodlights.

The circuit is fast. Very fast. Average speeds around the Jeddah Corniche Circuit are around 250km/h - quicker than those at Silverstone, and second only to Monza - aka ‘The Temple of Speed’. It is, quite simply, the fastest street circuit ever seen in Formula 1 - while the track also features the most corners on the calendar with 27, many of them quick, sinuous bends as the drivers wend their way along the Jeddah waterfront.




As a temporary facility, Albert Park can be quite bumpy, while the circuit at the start of the weekend is often slippery, rubbering in as the sessions progress. It's also a circuit that requires a well-sorted chassis, with several spots on the track where the drivers require a reactive front end to allow them to chuck it into a corner - the main one being the rapid Turn 11-12 chicane. Melbourne is also one of the faster tracks on the calendar, with Lewis Hamilton's 2019 pole lap set at an average of over 235km/h.



The super-high g force Turns 7 and 8 are loved by the drivers, while the circuit also features one of the longest straights on the calendar, the 1.2km stretch that separates Turns 13-14.






Having made its F1 debut in May 2022, the Miami International Autodrome is a temporary circuit, but one designed to have a permanent feel. Set in the Hard Rock Stadium complex in Miami Gardens, home to the NFL's famous Miami Dolphins franchise, the track is the culmination of a development process that simulated no less than 36 different layouts before settling on a thrilling, 19-turn lap that provides a street circuit vibe, not dissimilar to Melbourne's Albert Park.

The Florida race is one of three US races on the calendar alongside the Austin and Las Vegas Grand Prix.




Imola had its foundation stone laid in March 1950. It was ready for testing by October 1952, while racing began at the circuit in 1953. The track was first awarded the honour of hosting the Italian Grand Prix in 1980. From 1981, Imola was taking on its famous 'San Marino' title and going on to host a total of 27 Grand Prix up until 2006. Imola returned to the F1 calendar amid the Covid-19 changes of 2020 and only recently signed a contract until 2025.

The circuit offers a thrill ride. After testing his AlphaTauri AT01 at the track in the build-up to the 2020 season, Pierre Gasly called the experience one of the best he'd ever had in a Formula 1 car, while his then-team mate Daniil Kvyat remarked that "an F1 car through corners like Acque Minerali - the entrance is so fast, it's so cool. It really gives you a lot of adrenaline." The anti-clockwise circuit is certainly fast, with an old-school feel as the drivers put it on the line in iconic corners like the aforementioned Acque Minerali and Piratella.




Monaco remains one of the most prestigious and iconic auto races in the world, long recognized for its entertainment and celebrity presence. It is a track nearly all drivers love, forcing them to put their skills on the line and rewarding millimetric accuracy. Overtaking on the tight streets is harder, however, with the 2003 Grand Prix witnessing a grand total of zero passing moves.

Motorsport's most famous street circuit takes six weeks to build up and organize, offering drivers with the challenge of negotiating numerous elevations shifts and very tight corners, including one of the slowest corners in F1 racing.






The Circuit de Catalunya was built in 1989 through the efforts of a Consortium composed of the Catalan Government, the Reial Automòbil Club de Catalunya (RACC) and the Montmeló Town Council. In September 1991, the 35th Spanish F1 Grand Prix was held following a 17 year absence. The circuit features a good mix of high and low speed corners, with the challenging Turn 3 right-hander a great chance to evaluate the balance of the car.

The track offers plenty of choice for spectators with almost the whole track overlooked by grandstands or general admission areas. On the outside of Turn 1, Grandstand A will let you see the best overtaking spot on the track, while the general admission area around Turn 3 will provide the awe-inspiring sight of Formula 1 cars being pushed to the limit of their downforce capabilities.



The Red Bull Ring packs a lot into a short lap. The first half rewards power, as the cars blast along three straights separated by a pair of uphill right-handers. 


The first Formula 1 World Championship round on May 13th, 1950 was hosted at Silverstone. It continues to be a top draw for fans of Formula 1, offering a rich tradition of racing, a fast and challenging track, as well as the constant prospect of weather playing a critical role in race day strategy. It's hard to stop the goose bumps from prickling as you walk around one of the great cathedrals of motorsport, while in terms of atmosphere, the British fans are always reliably raucous.

At the 2018 British Grand Prix, Lewis Hamilton compared a flat-out lap around Silverstone to flying a fighter jet, which should tell you all you need to know about the Northamptonshire circuit. Despite numerous layout changes over the years, Silverstone has always maintained its essential character as one of the fastest tracks on the F1 calendar, while historic corners like Maggotts, Becketts and Abbey provide some of the biggest challenges for racing drivers anywhere in the world.


Home of the first Grand Prix to have been held behind the “Iron Curtain” in 1986. The Hungaroring was built in record time and remains today a major attraction in Hungary.

Held in the summer, the circuit is built in a natural bowl allowing excellent vantage points for spectators. That means that any of the grandstands located on or around the main straight should provide a view of other parts of the track too.

The lack of straights at the Hungaroring often sees it compared to a karting circuit - and it's true, the resemblance is uncanny. With several series of corners to string together, teams opt for Monaco levels of downforce, with a well-sorted chassis tending to be rewarded over horsepower given the short straights on offer. It's a challenge many of the drivers relish, however, with finding a good rhythm key to setting fast lap times.




The Circuit de Spa-Francorchamps is legendary among race enthusiasts for its long-standing history and unique setting. It is considered one of the most challenging tracks in the world, mainly due to its fast, hilly, and twisty layout within the Ardennes Forest. The size of the track and the nature of Belgian weather means it can sometimes be raining on one part of the track and dry on another, meaning grip can vary from one corner to the next.

Spa is among Formula 1 drivers' most loved tracks, with its mix of long straights and challenging fast corners allowing them to push their cars to the edge of their capabilities - if it's dry, that is. The size of the track and the nature of Belgian weather means it can sometimes be raining on one part of the track and dry on another, meaning grip can vary from one corner to the next. Keep an eye on the thrilling Eau Rouge, arguably the most famous sequence of corners in the world, as the drivers flick left, right, and then up the hill through Raidillon.




Zandvoort was first opened in 1948, part of the wave of post-war motorsport enthusiasm that swept across Europe. Originally made up of a mixture of permanent track and public roads that snaked through the sand dunes of the Zandvoort resort town, the Dutch Automobile Racing Club - who initiated the plans for the circuit - brought in 1927 Le Mans winner Sammy Davis to consult on the layout for the original 4.2km track. After a break since 1985, Formula 1 returned to Zandvoort in 2021.

The current F1 drivers describe the track 'really quick', 'pretty insane', 'crazy' and 'old-school' that many of them tackled in their junior category days. We'd also add 'undulating' to that list. The Zandvoort track swoops and flows through the sand dunes, creating a rollercoaster-like feel to the lap.




The Autodromo Nazionale Monza was built in just 110 days and is the world's third purpose-built racetrack, coming after Brooklands in the UK and Indianapolis in the US. Monza opened its doors on September 3, 1922, just a week before it hosted that year's Italian Grand Prix. It was then part of the original Formula 1 calendar in 1950 and has held the Italian Grand Prix every year bar one since.

Formula 1's fastest ever lap was set at Monza - Williams driver Juan Pablo Montoya's 260.6km/h effort during practice for the 2004 Grand Prix - which should give you some idea of the nature of the track the locals call 'La Pista Magica'. Cars are on full throttle for 80% of the lap and hit their Vmax on the circuit's 1.1km start/finish straight. From there, they roar off into the historic park section, where a series of big stops into tight chicanes give the brakes a good workout.



The six kilometre, anti-clockwise layout of the circuit offers a mixture of wide and open straights as well as tight and twisty corners. The circuit starts with a long main straight along the Baku shoreline, then loop around Government House before heading west to Maiden Tower. Here, the track has a narrow uphill traversal and then circle the Old Town before opening up onto a 2.2 km [1.4 mi] stretch along Neftchilar Avenue back to the start line.



The 5.063km Marina Bay Circuit is one of the most physically demanding on the calendar, its bumpy street surface coupled with humid conditions giving the drivers plenty to think about. With 23 corners, they are working the wheel a lot, too, around the high-speed lap - the physical stress causing them to lose as much as 3kg over the course of a race. The circuit also boasts some of the most unique features of any track on the F1 calendar, including Turn 18, which actually sees the drivers pass underneath a grandstand.




The Circuit of The Americas, designed by Hermann Tilke in collaboration with American architectural firm HKS, endured something of a nerval start, with construction suffering several setbacks. It was well worth the wait, though, when 1978 F1 champion Mario Andretti opened the track on October 21 2012.

If the corners at COTA seem familiar, they should be. Turns 3 through 6 look not dissimilar to Silverstone's high-speed run through Maggotts/Becketts or the S Curves at Suzuka, while Turns 12 through 15 mimic Hockenheim's stadium section. Meanwhile, the uphill run into wide, wide Turn 1 - hey, everything's bigger in Texas, right? - has provided some fine overtaking action in the track's short life.

In 1959, the father of Mexico's most famous racing brothers, Ricardo and Pedro Rodriguez, was an advisor to Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateo, and had a word in his boss's ear about building a racing circuit in Mexico City's Magdalena Mixiuhca sports park using the existing internal roads. El Presidente liked the idea, and work on the track was completed in under a year.

The racetrack is located over 2,200m above sea level, which makes it the highest altitude venue on the F1 calendar. The thin air at this altitude presents a unique challenge for cars and drivers.


To put it in perspective, Brazil's Interlagos, the second-highest race location, is at around 800m above sea level.




Building work began on what ended up being called the Autodromo Jose Carlos Pace - but what is more commonly referred to as Interlagos - all the way back in 1938. The track designers took their inspiration from three main circuits: Brooklands in the UK, Roosevelt Raceway in the USA and Montlhery in France.

Buoyed by the success of Brazil's Emerson Fittipaldi, Formula 1 first jetted into Interlagos for a world championship race in 1973. Fans were treated to a home win in the first three Brazilian Grands Prix, with Fittipaldi victorious in 1973 and 1974, while Carlos Pace won in 1975.



Las Vegas hosted two Formula 1 race in 1981 and 1982 on a temporary track next to the Caesars Palace hotel. 


The circuit was built within just over a year in preparation for hosting Qatar's first ever MotoGP event in 2004. In 2021 Qatar hosted Formula 1 for the very first time and signed an additional 10-year deal to host the sport from 2023 - missing one year because of the FIFA World Cup.

The track is fast and flowing where medium- and high-speed corners predominate. Over one kilometre of the track's total length is made up of the main straight, which provides plenty of overtaking opportunities into Turn 1.

The Hermann Tilke-designed track, inaugurated in 2009 and located on Yas Island is Formula One’s first ever day-night race, starting in the afternoon and finishing after sunset. Floodlights are activated from the start of the race to provide a transition into the evening.

The circuit is dominated by its 1.2km straight between Turns 7 and 8 - which, with slow-speed corners marking its beginning and end, makes it a honeypot for overtaking moves. Other highlights include the tricky run through Turns 15 and 16 into 17, which forces the drivers to brake hard with bags of lateral load still on the car.

6. SUPPORT RACE

6.2. F1 ACADEMY

INTRODUCTION

Launched in 2023, F1 ACADEMY™ is an ambitious new project from Formula 1 to improve female participation in motorsport, both on and off the track.

The series is designed to develop and prepare female drivers to progress to higher levels of competition by giving drivers access to more track time, racing and testing, as well as support with technical, physical, and mental preparations.

The second season of F1 ACADEMY, which will see the series support the FIA Formula One World Championship™ at seven events across three continents, is set to feature a total of 14 races.

The series began in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia on March 7 and will finish in Abu Dhabi on December 8. In addition to the hosts of the opening and closing rounds, Miami, Qatar, and Singapore will all join the calendar for the first time, with Zandvoort and Barcelona returning for a second year.

This season's calendar was designed to span three continents, Europe, Asia, and North America, and will feature a mix of street circuits and traditional circuits and will be supplemented by an extensive official testing calendar.

F1 ACADEMY is also supported by all ten F1 teams, who each provide a driver to the series and have their livery on one car. The remaining drivers in the series are supported by Official Partners including Charlotte Tilbury, Puma, and Tommy Hilfiger.

This season the top five classified drivers in the 2024 Drivers' Standings will get FIA Super Licence Points. The Champion will receive 10 Super Licence points, while the drivers finishing second, third, fourth, and fifth will receive 7, 5, 3 and 1 points respectively. These Super Licence points will help fuel drivers' progression up the single seater pyramid.

In an initiative designed to help strengthen the talent pool in the regions in which F1 ACADEMY races, the series also introduced Wild Card entries at select races across its calendar for 2024. INTRODUCTION

Porsche Carrera Cup North America is the premier one-make race series in the United States and Canada utilizing a combination of the latest Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race car, type 992, and Yokohama's ADVAN® A005 racing slick to challenge the best road and street race courses on the continent. The fourth season of the championship is scheduled to host 16-rounds at eight venues. Each 40-minute race counts toward a season-long driver and team championship in each of three classes: Pro, Pro-Am and Masters.

As the pinnacle one-make series of the Porsche Motorsport Pyramid North America, the series is a launching point for young drivers looking to move up to open competition. Previous champions Seb Priaulx (2021), Parker Thompson (2022), Riley Dickinson (2023) and two-time runner-up Kay van Berlo (2021, 2022) have each moved into open competition racing, where they compete in the SRO GT4 America, IMSA Pilot Challenge or the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship in the 2024 season.
